There are natural laws that control the world in which we live. There are also spiritual laws which determine your relationship with God.

1 LAW ONE GOD LOVES YOU AND OFFERS A WONDERFUL PLAN FOR YOUR LIFE.

GOD'S LOVE

“God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.” (John 3:16)

GOD'S PLAN

[Christ speaking] *“I came that they might have life, and might have it abundantly”* [that it might be full and meaningful]. (John 10:10)

Not all people have experienced this life, because...

2 LAW TWO PEOPLE ARE SINFUL AND SEPARATED FROM GOD SO WE CANNOT KNOW AND EXPERIENCE GOD'S LOVE AND PLAN FOR OUR LIFE.

PEOPLE ARE SINFUL

“All have sinned and fall short of God's glorious standard.” (Romans 3:23)

We were created to be friends with God; but we chose to go our own way, and friendship with God was broken. This is what the Bible calls sin. This is shown:

1. when people rebel against God;
2. when people do not care about God; and
3. when people do not live up to God's perfect standard.

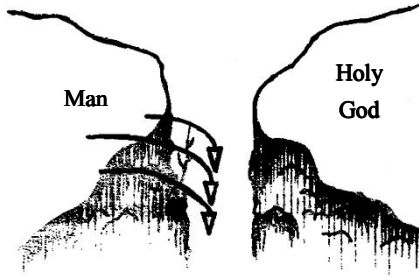
“Kəc kedhia aa rëec looi, ku kaa dëek nhuöom de Nhialic.” (Romai 3:23)

PEOPLE ARE SEPARATED

“The wages of sin is death” [spiritual separation from God].
(Romans 6:23)



God is holy and people are sinful. There is a great separation between the two. The arrows show how people try to reach God and the abundant life through their own efforts: such as living a good life, being religious, helping others etc., but all their efforts fail.

The third law gives the only answer to this problem...

3 LAW THREE

JESUS CHRIST IS THE **ONLY** WAY PEOPLE CAN REACH GOD. HE DIED FOR US. THROUGH HIM YOU CAN KNOW GOD AND EXPERIENCE HIS LOVE AND PLAN FOR YOUR LIFE.

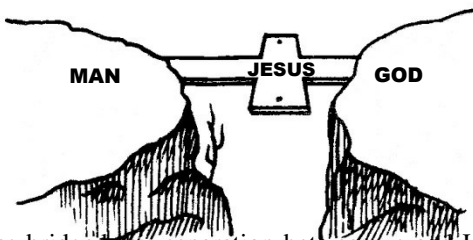
HE DIED AND ROSE FROM THE DEAD

“For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God.” (1 Peter 3:18)

“After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God.” (Acts 1:3)

HE IS THE ONLY WAY

“Jesus said to him, ‘I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me’.” (John 14:6)

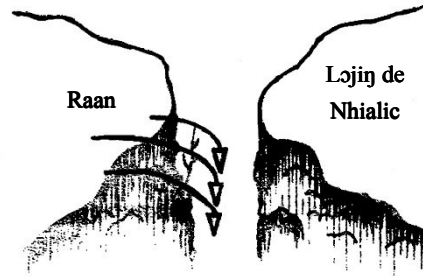


God has bridged this separation between us and Himself by sending His Son Jesus Christ, to die on the cross in our place.

It is not enough just to know these three laws...

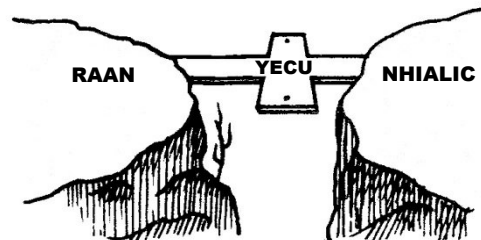

4 LAW FOUR

WE MUST INDIVIDUALLY RECEIVE JESUS CHRIST AS SAVIOUR AND LORD; THEN WE CAN KNOW AND EXPERIENCE GOD'S LOVE AND PLAN FOR OUR LIVES.

WE MUST RECEIVE CHRIST THROUGH FAITH

"As many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name." (John 1:12)

"By grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, that no one should boast." (Ephesians 2:8,9)

WE RECEIVE CHRIST BY INVITING HIM INTO OUR LIVES

[Christ is speaking] "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him." (Revelation 3:20)

It is not enough just to agree with Christ's teachings. Receiving Christ means turning to God from self (repenting). We trust Christ to come into our lives and to forgive us our sins. We let Him make us what he wants us to be.

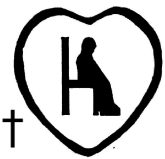
"Koc kedhia ye Yen loor, ayeke yiën riëer bik ya wät ke Nhialic." (John 1:12)

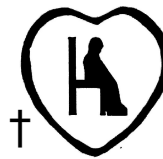
† – Christ is outside the life

YOU CAN RECEIVE CHRIST RIGHT NOW

Ask Him to come into your life. Trust Him to do what He has promised. He is more concerned with what you mean in your heart than in the words you say. You may want to pray:

“Lord Jesus, I need You. I have been controlling my own life and have sinned against You. Thank You for forgiving my sins. Come into my life and take control of my life. Make me the kind of person You want me to be.”

Does this prayer show the desire of your heart?

If it does, pray this prayer right now, and Christ will come into your life, as He promised.

HOW TO KNOW THAT CHRIST IS IN YOUR LIFE

- Did you just receive Christ into your life? According to His promise in Revelation 3:20, where is Christ right now?
- Christ said that He would come into your life. Would He lie to you?
- How do you know that God has answered your prayer? (Because you can trust God and His Word.)

THE BIBLE PROMISES ETERNAL LIFE TO ALL WHO RECEIVE CHRIST

*“The witness is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, in order that you may **know** that you have eternal life” (1 John 5:11–13).*

Thank God often that Christ is in your life. He will never leave you (Hebrews 13:5). You can know that Christ lives in you and that you have eternal life because of His promise.

DO NOT DEPEND ON FEELINGS

The Christian lives by believing God and what He says in in the Bible. The promise of God's Word is our authority.

This drawing of a truck shows how the **Truth** of the Bible, **Faith** and **Feelings** work together in your Christian life.



1. Truth has the power to lead us.
2. We are joined to the power of Truth by Faith.
3. As we obey the Truth, our feelings follow along in the right way.
4. We trust God and His Truth, not our Feelings

- Ye nyic kedë ke Yecu ci lōŋdu dhuk nhom? (nëŋö, yin ye Nhialic gam ku wëtde).

Baibol ee koc thōn piir atheer kedhia koc ye Yecu Kritho gam

“Ku lëk eke, ye Nhialic ee wō yien piir athee, ku yepiirë, atō nē Wëndëic. Ran ye naŋ, Wëndë ee naŋ piir; ku ran cīn Wën de Nhialic acin yepiirë. Keekakë aacake gäär week, we koc ye rin ke Wën de Nhialic gam, bāk ya nyic ke we ye naŋ piir atheer; ku bāk rin ke Wën de Nhialic ya gam.” (1 Joōn 5:11-13)

Leec Nhialic, nē kē tō Kritho nē pīrduic. Acī jam nē guōpde ye yin cā bi kan ya pāl wei, ku ka cīn kē koŋ Yen yin ya waan (Eberu 13:5). Alëu ba nyic lon tō Kritho nē pīrdu yic nē kē ciën ye lueel.

Krithano ee piir nē gām yen Nhialic gam ku kē cī lueel nē Baibolic. Lōŋ cīi Nhialic lueel yennëke ya rierda. Kē thel kathar anyuth wō yic de Baibol, gām ku tāk aaye luui ëtök nē pīrdun de Kirithanoic.



1. Yic aŋōŋ rier yen wō ŋōr.
2. Wō ye rier de yic ke māt nē gām.
3. Të ye wō yic gam ke tāŋda ee locāp nē dhōl yic kedhia.
4. Wō ye Nhialic gam ku yithke, ku ka cie nyiëc tāŋda.

NOW THAT YOU HAVE RECEIVED CHRIST

The moment that you received Christ by faith many things happened:

1. Christ came into your life. (Revelation 3:20 ; Colossians 1:27)
2. Your sins were forgiven. (Colossians 1:14)
3. You became a child of God. (John 1:12)
4. You will begin to experience God's love and purpose for your life (John 10:10; 2 Corinthians 5:14,15,17).

Can you think of anything more wonderful that could happen to you than receiving Christ?

Would you like to thank God in prayer right now for what He has done for you? By thanking God, you demonstrate your faith.

SUGGESTIONS FOR CHRISTIAN GROWTH

Spiritual growth results from trusting Jesus Christ. "The righteous man shall live by faith" (Galatians 3:11). A life of faith will enable you to trust God increasingly with every detail of your life, and to practice the following:

Go to God in prayer daily. (John 15:7)

Read God's Word daily (Acts 17:11); begin with the Gospel of John.

Obey God moment by moment. (John 14:21)

Witness for Christ by your life and words. (Matthew 4:19; John 15:8)

Trust God for every detail of your life. (1 Peter 5:7)

Have God control and empower your daily life and witness. (Galatians 5:16,17 & Acts 1:8)

THE CHURCH IS IMPORTANT

When logs are together; they burn brightly. Put one log aside on the cold ground and the fire on that log will begin to go out.

It is important that you should join other people who have received Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

If you abandon meeting with other Christians then your faith will not grow strong and you will suffer the consequences. You know that a cow that is not part of the herd and roams by itself will be eaten by the wild beasts.

You should go to a Church where people believe that the Bible is true and where Jesus Christ is obeyed.

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another." (Hebrews 10:25)

- Ye Nhialic nōōth nē pīrduic ēbēn. (1 Pet 5:7)
- Cōk Nhialic ye pīrdu dōk ku ye naŋ rīeer nē yen. (Galatai 5:16,17 ku Dutuuc 1:8)
